Nova Southeastern University & America Mentors Case Study

In Spring 2021, the America Mentors team was introduced to Emilio Lorenzo, Director of Student Success at Nova Southeastern University (NSU). After completing an America Mentors demo and talking through NSU's mentoring program goals and objectives, America Mentors and NSU's formal relationship began! The Student Success Scholars program was born, with the first mentoring cohort launching in Fall 2021.

Student Success Scholars is a peer-to-peer mentoring program offered to full-time NSU first-generation freshmen and sophomores. Strong high school performance is a requirement to participate, and upper-class students are able to serve as mentors to Scholars.

Since Fall 2021, America Mentors has been the technology fueling Student Success Scholars, allowing the program to increase its overall reach and success rate, serving more underrepresented students year over year.

2021-22 Program Metrics

- 165 Student Success Scholars enrolled
- 133 of 165 Student Success Scholars enrolled for 2022-23 program (81% overall retention)
- 2.84 cumulative GPA

2022-23 Program Metrics

- 593 Student Success Scholars enrolled
- 477 of 593 Student Success Scholars enrolled for 2023-24 program (80% overall retention)
- 3.01 cumulative GPA

2023-24 Program Metrics

- 996 Student Success Scholars enrolled
- 2024-25 Retention TBD
- Cumulative GPA TBD

✓ Year over year retention*

Overall NSU FTIC (first time in college retention) is 77%; for those participating in the mentoring program, it's **80**%
